8) c) 4H { partner is known to have 5 Hrts and 10 points }

9) b) Bid 4H ie repeat second suit showing 5-5

10) Hmm... think I would make the less than orthodox bid
of 1NT { if I am honest } BUT the "correct" response is :
c) 3D showing a good six card Di suit and 15/16 pts

11) a) 1H - lower of 4 card majors

12) a) 2NT- NO other choice
" ooh , you mean you can bid 2NT with a 5 card spade suit ?"

13) c) double. You should want to bid as opps appear limited and partner
must have something - may push opps higher or play in p/score ourselves.

14) c) 2Sp - same reasons as above. Double also acceptable but you are the one with
a five card suit and should bid it really.

on the lead of the Ace Di :

i) Drop the J di on the opponents lead of the Ace di . { A false card that if done
smoothly and earnestly enough ! may fool them into switching. }

Basically the opps can take A + K di and A + K cl so we are in trouble unless we can
scare them a little .

ii) Same story. Odd question really if I say so myself
Drop the Q cl it *might* put them off.

Really we need the opps to make a mistake { and lead Hrts or spades };
they probably shouldn't { and won't } BUT you must try and influence the outcome
if you can.
